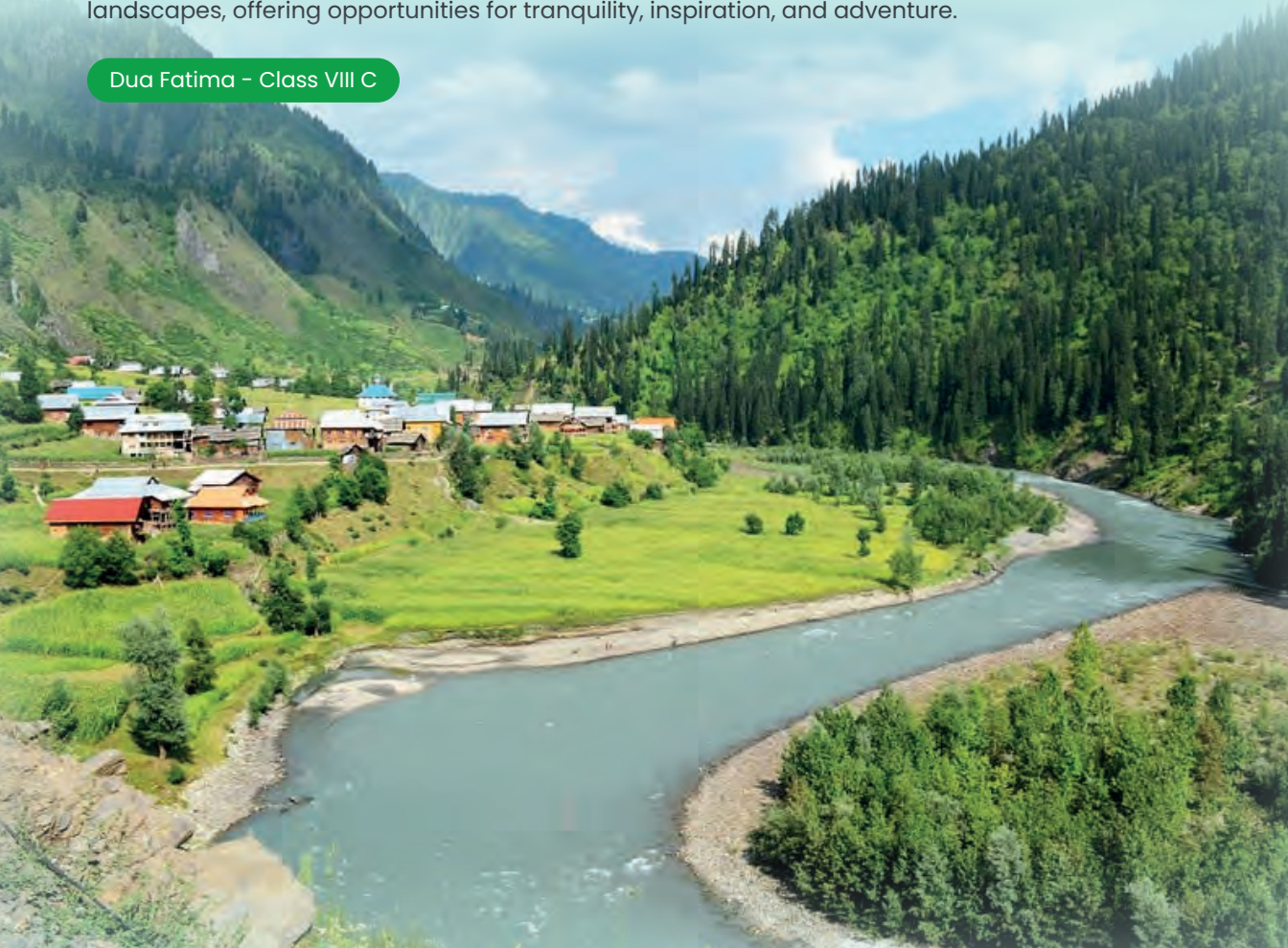

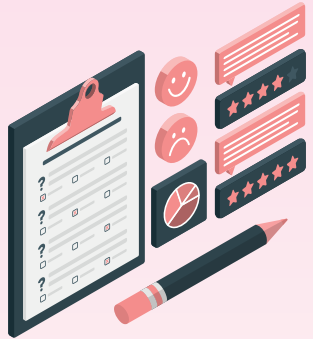

Life of Imam Muhammad Taqi (a.s.)

The ninth imam from the ahlul bayt of the prophet (s.a.w.w.), is well-known by the two titles **al-Jawwad**, the generous one, and **al-Taqi**, the pious one. Imam Mohammed Jawwad was born in Medina on Friday, the 10th of Rajab, 195 A.H. The name of his mother is Sabikah (or Khayzuran), and his father was the 8th Imam, Imam Ali bin Musa Al-Razah (a.s.). He was approximately seven or eight years old when his father was martyred.

Despite his age, Imam Taqi (a.s.) was the most learned individual of his time. Several people doubted if such a young boy could be the Imam. But they were astounded when they tried asking the Imam for answers to their questions.

The first meeting between the Imam and Mamoon was in Baghdad when Mamoon went out with his men in the streets. He was passed by some children who saw him with his men and ran away from fear except for **Imam Jawwad**. When Mamoon saw him, he stopped and asked why he had not run away then Imam Jawwad wisely replied, "The Streets are wide; you can easily pass through, and I have no guilt or fear of you." Mamoon was so astonished by this answer and asked "What is your name?" The Imam said, "**Mohammed**, son of **Ali Al-Razah (a.s.)**". As Mamoon rode off, he realized that Imam Jawwad was as special as his father, Imam Ali Razah. So he decided to marry his daughter to Imam Jawwad. Mamoon hoped if they would have a child, he would also be his successor through the Imam. Later in life, Imam Jawwad agreed to marry Mamoon's daughter, but she did not have any children. There Mamoon's plan failed.

After Mamoon, the next unjust ruler, Mutasim, openly disliked Imam Jawwad due to his popularity, knowledge, and piety. Mutasim plotted and finally ordered the Imam to be poisoned. Imam Jawwad was martyred at a young age of 25. He was buried next to his grandfather, Imam Musa al Kazim in Baghdad, in the area called **Kazmain**.

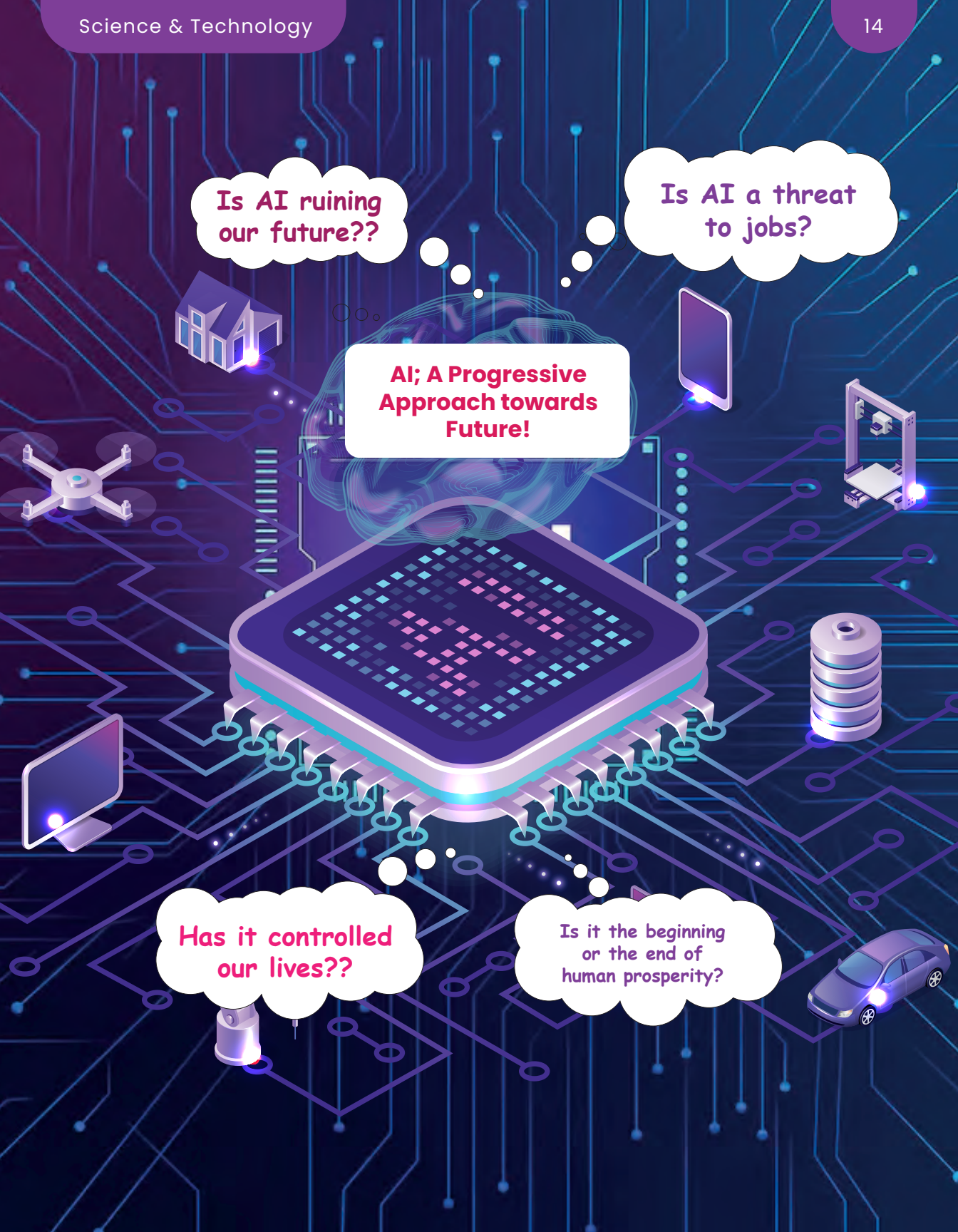

AI and Our Future

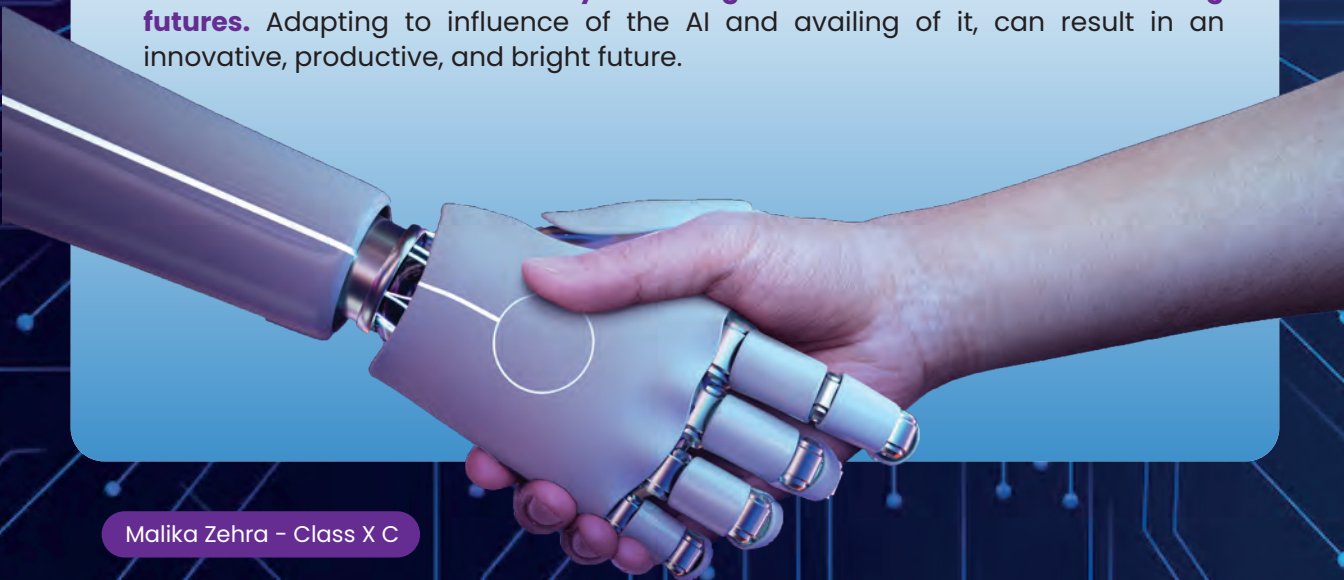

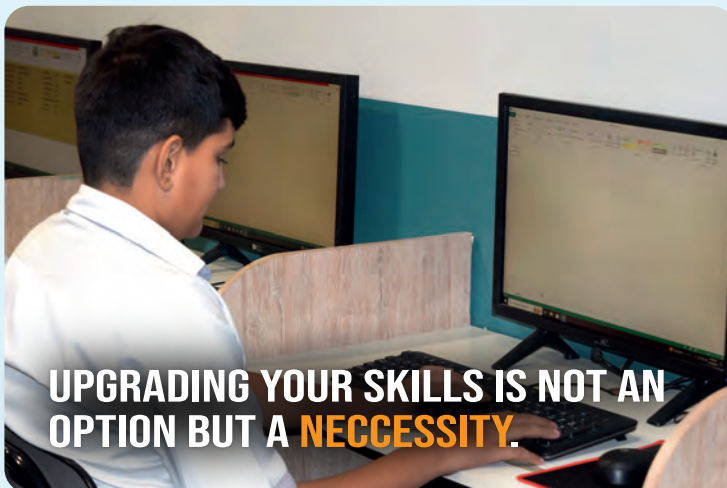
Own Style of Play:

Extraction of DNA from Strawberries

REQUIREMENTS:

- 2 strawberries (fresh or frozen, but remove the green leaves)
- 2 teaspoon dish detergent
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ cup water
- 2 plastic cups
- 1 coffee filter
- ½ cup cold rubbing alcohol
- 1 coffee stirrer
- 1 scientist (you!)



STEPS:

- 1) Place strawberries in a plastic bag.
After closing the bag, SMASH the strawberries for ~2 minutes until nicely smashed!
- 2) Make DNA extraction solution by adding detergent, salt and water to the first plastic cup
- 3) After gently mixing the extraction solution (until salt is dissolved), pour it into the bag of smashed strawberries.
- 4) Reseal the bag and ***gently*** massage and mix the mixture for a minute. Try to avoid making too many soap bubbles!
- 5) Place the coffee filter over the opening of the second plastic cup. Open the plastic bag, and pour the liquid onto the coffee filter. Then wait for the liquid to drip through the coffee filter into the plastic cup, leaving the strawberry *schmutz* on the coffee filter.
- 6) You're almost there! Pour an equal amount of cold rubbing alcohol into the liquid in the second plastic cup.
- 7) Gently move the cup around in circles and watch the whitish *snot-like* material form in the upper layer of liquid — that is the strawberry DNA!
- 8) Use the clean coffee stirrer to pick up strawberry DNA out of the liquid.

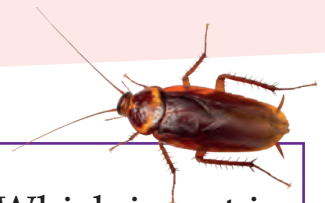

امام جعفر صادقؑ ہمارے چھٹے امام ہیں۔ آپؑ کی ولادت ۱۷ ربیع الاول ۸۳ ہجری کو مدینہ میں ہوئی۔ آپؑ کا مشہور لقب صادق ہے۔ آپؑ کے والد امام محمد باقرؑ اور والدہ بی بی ام فروہؑ ہیں۔ امام محمد باقرؑ کی شہادت کے بعد آپؑ کے دورِ امامت کا آغاز ہوا۔ یہ وہ دور تھا جب بنو امیہ کی حکومت ختم ہو رہی تھی اور بنو عباس اس پر قابض ہونے کی کوشش کر رہے تھے۔ امامؑ نے اس موقع سے بھرپور فائدہ اٹھایا اور علومِ اسلامی کو پوری دنیا میں پھیلادیا۔ آپؑ کی درسگاہ میں ہزاروں کی تعداد میں طلباء نے مختلف علوم میں مہارت حاصل کی۔ بابائے کیمیا جابر بن الاحیان کا نام بھی آپؑ کے شاگردوں میں شامل ہے۔ بنو عباس کے حاکم منصور نے دیکھا کہ آپؑ کا فیضِ علم مختلف علاقوں میں پھیل رہا ہے تو وہ آپؑ کی شہرت سے خائف ہونے لگا اور اس نے مدینہ کے گورنر محمد بن سلیمان کے ذریعے آپؑ کو زہر دلو کر ۱۵ شوال ۱۴۸ ہجری کو شہید کروا دیا۔ آپؑ کی قبر مطہر بھی جنت البقیع میں موجود ہے۔

شہزادی فاطمہ الزہراء سلام اللہ علیہا

بعض روایات کے مطابق جنت البقیع میں ام اللہ جناب فاطمہ الزہراءؑ کا مرقد بھی موجود ہے۔ مگر یقین کے ساتھ یہ نہیں کہا جاسکتا کہ شہزادی کوئینؑ کی اصل قبر مبارک کس مقام پر موجود ہے۔ بی بی فاطمہؑ کی ولادت ۲۰ جمادی الثانی کو ہوئی۔ آپؑ کے والد محترم رسول خدا خاتم النبیین محمد مصطفیٰ ﷺ اور والدہ بی بی خدیجہؑ ہیں۔ آپؑ کے شوہر نامدار امیر المومنین مولائے کائنات علی ابن ابی طالبؑ اور آپؑ کے فرزند جوانانِ جنت کے سردار امام حسنؑ اور امام حسینؑ ہیں۔ آپؑ کے تیسرے فرزند کا نام جناب محسنؑ ہے جو کہ شکمِ مادر ہی میں شہید کر دئے گئے۔ آپؑ کی بیٹیاں بی بی زینبؑ اور بی بی ام کلثومؑ ہیں۔

بعد رسول ﷺ شہزادی کوئینؑ پر اس قدر ظلم ڈھائے گئے کہ آپؑ خود فرماتی ہیں کہ اگر روشن دنوں پر ڈھائے جاتے تو وہ تاریک راتوں میں تبدیل ہو جاتے۔ شہزادی اس حالت میں دنیا سے گئیں کہ پہلو شکستہ تھا اور یوں کہیں تو عجب نہ ہوگا کہ آج تک آپؑ کی تربت بھی شکستہ ہے۔

انہدام جنت البقیع

جنت البقیع مدینے کا وہ قبرستان ہے جس میں، رسول خدا ﷺ کی چچی جناب فاطمہ بنت اسدؓ، آپ ﷺ کے فرزند، آپ ﷺ کی پھوپھیوں، ہمارے چار آئمہؓ اور اصحاب رسول ﷺ کی قبور موجود ہیں۔ یہ چار آئمہؓ امام حسنؓ، امام زین العابدینؓ، امام محمد باقرؓ اور امام جعفر صادقؓ ہیں۔ ایک روایت کے مطابق شہزادی فاطمہ الزہراؓ کی قبر مطہر بھی یہی ہے۔ جنت البقیع کو غرقہ بھی کہا جاتا ہے۔ جنت البقیع کے بارے میں مشہور ہے کہ یہ پہلے ایک باغ تھا اور بعد میں قبرستان بنا۔ جب اس قبرستان میں آئمہ معصومینؓ کی قبور بننا شروع ہوئیں تو ان کے اوپر گنبد بھی تعمیر کیے جانے لگے۔ بغض و کینہ سے لبریز دشمنان اہل بیتؓ نے ان قبروں کو ۸ شوال ۱۳۴۴ ہجری کے غمناک دن مسمار کر دیا۔ یہاں ہم ان معصومین کا مختصر تعارف بیان کر رہے ہیں جو جنت البقیع کے اجڑے ہوئے قبرستان میں مدفون ہیں۔

نمل زہراء: جماعت ششم

امام حسن علیہ السلام

خانہ علیؓ و فاطمہؓ میں پہلے فرزند یعنی امام حسن مجتبیٰؓ کی ولادت باسعادت ۱۵ رمضان المبارک ۳ ہجری کو ہوئی۔ آپؓ کے مشہور القابات سبط رسولؓ، ذکی اور مجتبیٰ ہیں اور آپؓ کی کنیت ابو محمد ہے۔ ولادت کے بعد آپؓ نے پہلی غذا رسول اکرم ﷺ کی زبان مبارک سے حاصل کی۔ آپؓ کو میدان مہلبہ میں فرزند رسول ﷺ کی حیثیت سے سب سے آگے رکھا گیا۔ حدیث کساء کے مطابق آپؓ ہی وہ پہلے فرد تھے جو زیر کساء اپنے نانا رسول اکرم ﷺ کی خدمت میں حاضر ہوئے۔ آپؓ کی کل عمر مبارک ۴۷ سال تھی۔ آپؓ کی تاریخ شہادت ۲۸ صفر المظفر ۵۰ ہجری ہے۔ سبب شہادت زہر بنا جو کہ آپؓ کی زوجہ جعدہ بنت اشعث نے آپؓ کو دیا تھا۔ آپؓ کی قبر مبارک جنت البقیع میں ہے۔

امام علی ابن الحسین (زین العابدین) علیہ السلام

جمادی الثانی ۳۸ ہجری کی پندرہویں تاریخ تھی جب مالک کائنات نے امام حسینؓ کو پہلا فرزند عطا فرمایا، جس کا نام علی قرار پایا۔ امام علی ابن الحسینؓ کے مشہور القابات زین العابدینؓ، سید الساجدینؓ اور سجاد ہیں اور کنیت "ابو محمد" ہے۔ آپؓ کے والد کا نام امام حسینؓ اور والدہ ماجدہ کا نام بی بی شہربانوؓ ہے۔ آپؓ کو زین العابدینؓ یعنی عبادت کرنے والوں کی زینت کا لقب رسول خدا ﷺ نے اپنی زندگی میں عطا فرمایا تھا۔ آج بھی لوگ آپؓ کی دعاؤں کے مجموعے "صحیفہ کاملہ" سے فیض اٹھا رہے ہیں جس میں ہر موقع اور مناسبت کی دعائیں موجود ہیں۔ آپؓ کی شہادت ۲۵ محرم ۹۵ ہجری کو مدینے میں ہوئی۔

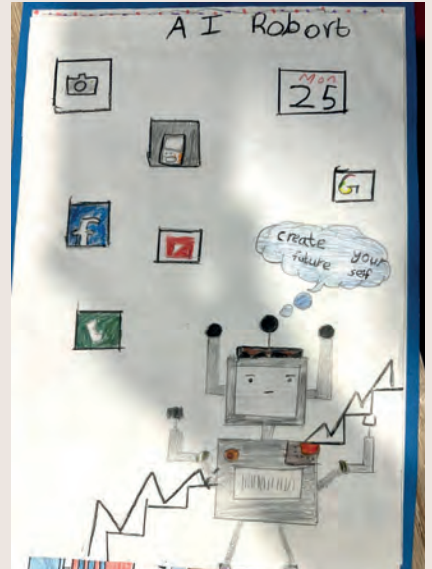
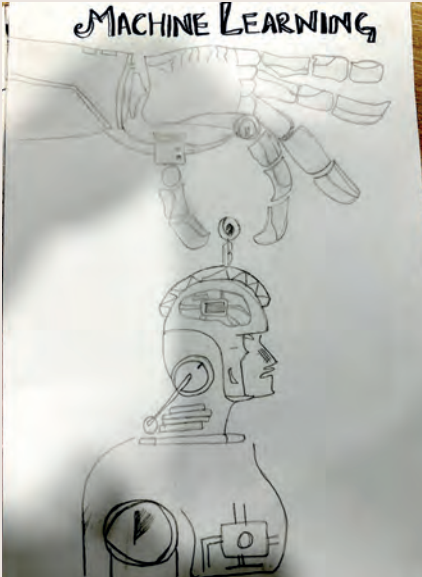
